

#### Ensuring Safety with UNI EN 131-7 Compliant Platform Ladders

Platform ladders, equipped with platforms and guardrails, are governed by the UNI EN 131-7 standard, which sets stringent requirements to ensure safety and stability. This standard is crucial for mitigating risks associated with using these ladders in work environments.

A key aspect of UNI EN 131-7 is the lateral stability test. To verify the ladder's stability, a weight of 75 kg is placed on the platform while a lateral force of 30 kg is applied to each side of the ladder. This test simulates conditions where an operator might lean against a wall or move laterally with tools. To meet the standard, the ladder must remain stable and not tip over during the test.

Additionally, UNI EN 131-7 requires that ladders provide complete protection for the operator. Guardrails must be at least 100 cm high to prevent accidental falls, and the top protection must ensure the operator's safety during ascent and descent without impeding necessary movement.

Faraone Industrie's ladders that comply with UNI EN 131-7 are designed to provide maximum safety and reliability even in the most demanding work environments. Investing in ladders that meet these standards significantly reduces the risk of accidents and enhances overall workplace safety.

## ACCIONA'S STRATEGY TO ADDRESS THE EFFECTS OF CLIMATE CHANGE ON WORKERS' HEALTH

ACCIONA is a global group that develops and manages sustainable infrastructure solutions. Our business spans the entire value chain, from design and construction through to operation and maintenance.

ACCIONA's goal is to lead the transition towards a low-carbon economy, bringing technical excellence and innovation to all our projects to design a better planet. We are committed to contributing to the economic and social development of the communities in which we operate.

As part of this sustainable commitment, the Health and Safety Department is fully committed to assessing and addressing the impacts of climate change on our workforce and partners. As the climate changes, average and extreme temperatures increase along with heat waves. These changes can put indoor and outdoor workers at greater risk for heat-related illnesses such as heat stroke and exhaustion, especially in physically demanding jobs. Heat-related fatigue can also affect a worker's alertness to work-related hazards, which can increase the chances of injury.

All these increased risk factors have been seriously considered when designing and implementing the profound technological transformation that is taking place in ACCIONA's Occupational Health and Safety activities, taking advantage of the opportunities offered by new technologies to predict, monitor and prevent their effects on the health of exposed workers.

In this regard, ACCIONA's Smart Control Centre plays a crucial role, as several of the digital sources integrated into it are specifically designed to provide data and information that allow us to understand the possible effects of heat and weather conditions on workers. Among these sources, two of them stand out.

Firstly, a forecasting system that provides top-quality weather data for any land or sea point in the world four days in advance on the temperatures, winds and rainfall forecast for each of the specific locations where ACCIONA operates. This information is collected in the Smart Center, which sends alarms and alerts to the workplaces so that specific plans and actions can be implemented in advance.

Secondly, the implementation of devices such as bracelets and helmets equipped with sensors to monitor the thermal stress of workers, generating alerts when dangerous values are reached and providing analytical capabilities to know the levels of exposure in different places, jobs and times, truly valuable information when designing and implementing impact programs to reduce these risks for the workforce.

All data obtained from the two sources described in previous paragraphs are then incorporated into a mathematical and algorithmic model integrated into the Smart Center that can predict feasible events including factors affected by climate change among the variables taken into account for the calculations, providing information for the development and implementation of strategies and action plans at different levels of the organization, from local to global, to reduce the impacts of climate change on the health of the workforce.



ACCIONA is obtaining several benefits since the implementation of this strategy, optimizing time and resources, providing legal security and, most importantly, being able to monitor, evaluate and control these emerging risks effectively.
